

> through good times and rough times as well. Every member in this club has the right and an obligation to continue making **BATOC** sure continues to thrive for the coming genera-


tions of this **Thunderbird** hobby to enjoy. It's a legacy to be proud of. So be sure to come out and enjoy one, or many, of the events that

ENTRY DEADLINE IS SEPTEMBER 1, 2017

Rather than awarding first, second and third prizes in each class, our judges will be asked to designate a percentage of the cars in each class to receive a ribbon indicating an "Award of Merit."
