



WWII Home Front, Rosie the Riveter Museum, and the SS Red Oak Victory

Saturday, November 18th



For our November event we will be touring the SS Red Oak Victory in the Richmond Shipyard. We'll also tour the Rosie the Riveter World War II Home Front National Historical Park to learn about Richmond, CA and the role of the Richmond Shipyard and its many hard-working residents during the wartime.

The SS Red Oak Victory is the last surviving ship built in the Kaiser Richmond Shipyards during World War II. Today, the Red Oak Victory remains a monument to the mean and women who worked in the war-related industries as part of the World War II Home Front. In 1998, the ship was saved from the Naval Reserve Fleet in Suisun Bay by a courageous group of men and women and has be under restoration since that time.
