

As mentioned before, I purchased a fuel injection unit for my other car. These are fairly simple units. They come with a limited number of set parameters that they will tune your fuel system to. They call it a "self learning system". Which means that it will tailor your fuel delivery to the way the user drives within the pre-programmed criteria already installed in the system. I have not installed it vet so I cannot give a complete review but I will update as things move along. These entry level systems seem well suited to our cars. Imagine getting in your Tbird and having it start right up and know that your fuel delivery is exactly what it should be. Its basically a computer controlled carburetion system. No more worries about vapor lock or if its going to run crappy in the mountains. I'll keep youall updated on the progress.

A QUICK STOP AT THE HOOD SUPPLY COMPANY

So you might think that this is the latest auto parts supply company, but in reality it is a great little bar and restaurant on the shores of the Sacramento River on the way home from our Olde Town Sacramento outing.
