


#### Election Luncheon

# DUES are DUE - December 1st



Don't forget we changed our bylaws and you should now pay your CTCI dues directly to CTCI. Their dues form should be in the Nov/Dec *Early Bird* issue out soon. To be an active member of BATOC you must also be a member of CTCI. This rule applies because CTCI covers our BATOC events with their insurance. Associate members do not need to join CTCI, but if they are not CTCI members, they may not drive their T-Bird, if any, to a BATOC event.

Make your check payable to BATOC and complete the form, including your CTCI membership number and the certification of minimum liability insurance. Life members please submit the form only to indicate your desire to remain active. Associate member dues are also \$20.00 annually.

Dues paying is a pain perhaps, but it will be much easier on everyone if you pay your dues on time! Late dues make much extra work for the Treasurer, and don't cost any less later! 
#### Get me to the Church on Time!
