

Disk Brake/Manifold Alert

(Reprinted from "The Wave", Gold Coast T-Bird Club)

Many of the disk brake conversions available today make use of later model dual master cylinders and proportioning valves. These cylinders and valves are in some cases placed directly in harms way from heat generated by the very close left exhaust manifold.


In some cases the heat form the exhaust manifold can cause fluid in the master cylinder or brake lines to boil. This can occur with the stock braking system in '55 through '60 Birds if the master cylinder outlet line is uninsulated or routed too close to the manifold. The boiling fluid with cause brake failure.

In all cases when modifying a braking system on should take great care to keep heat away from all brake components. In the case of disk conversions on Little "birds" the use of insulated lines and replacement of the stock exhaust manifolds with headers that are routed down and away from the brake system is highly recommended. Disk brakes are only safer if they work!
