#### **BATOC Caravanning Tips**

All of the rules of caravanning come down to two things – safety and keeping us all together. So, use your head in this regard and follow these tips:

- Keep up with the group and always stay in a tight group particularly through towns, traffic and lights. Try not to allow enough space for other cars to get in and split up the group.
- When pulling out of driveways, parking lots, etc. signal the car behind you that it is safe to pull without stopping. This eliminates the need for each car to pull up, stop, look and then proceed. This is a major step in keeping the group together.
- If we lose the back of the group, we will slow down and/or stop if it can be done safely to allow you to catch up. So, please do catch up as quickly as possible.
- Lane changes should ideally happen from the rear of the group. If you are bringing up the rear and know that we must change lanes up the road a bit, move over and allow space for the person in front of you to move over in front of you, etc. on up the line. So always pay attention to the car BEHIND you.
- Avoid cruising in the slow land of the freeway. Unless there are only two lanes, cruise in the second lane to avoid the merging of traffic from on and off ramps.
- VERY IMPORTANT do not go through the fast track lane of bridges. Many people do not have Fast Track for their birds. Stay in a line with the group and go through the toll lanes your Fast Track will still work. If you are paying cash, have your cash ready and your window rolled down.
- If you need to stop for any reason, please call or radio the leader of the caravan.
  We will then stop at the next appropriate spot. Don't be shy here if you need to stop, just say so.
- Caravanning etiquette is: Little Birds followed by Retro Birds followed by X- Brand.
- When using Walkie-Talkies, hold the radio at least 6" away from your mouth and speak normally do not yell.
- It is very important that the rear car and the lead car have Walkie-Talkie radios along with a few in the middle so that messages can be relayed.
- And I repeat, Keep up with the group and stay close to the car in front of you.

#### LEAKING THUNDERBIRDS BY Alan Leibel Reprinted from Feb 2002 WNIB

As we all know TBirds leak in the rain. I have often said that anyone who says that his or her bird doesn't leak is either lying or never driven in the rain. One of the most common leaks and most proficient is at the dog leg at the top front of the doors. Although there is a drain hole in the door and a gasket type seal it just doesn't work. So what most of do is put either a garbage sack or a kitchen size (13 gallon) sack with one edge covering the hole and the seal and the remaining sack on the inside of the door in the passenger compartment. Only a small portion of the sack is in the dog leg.

The concept is to have the lip of the sack between the door and door post collect the water and have it drain into the sack. All but the portion in the door of the sack should be open on the inside of the car. I usually have just a bit of the sack edge showing from the outside of the car. The sacks are large enough that the bottom of the sack sits on the floor. You should not have to hold the sack as it collects water. Then empty the sack from time to time, usually when you stop for fuel etc. Hopefully these directions are clear. If not, email me for clarification.

Another suggestion. I carry one of those super absorbent sponges. The sponge soaks up a lot more water than a normal sponge and will pull water out of the carpet. It won't dry your carpet but it will be damp instead of wet. They should be available at most hardware stores. One of our members bought one at Home Depot a year or two ago.

PS. Make sure you soak the sponge the night before a trip. When the sponge dries it gets hard like a brick. It needs to soak several hours before its usable. The very first time you may need to soak for 12 hours or so. Once fully wet I wring it out and put in a zip lock bag. It will be good for a week or so without having to soak it.

Hope this helps.






